Job Summary

The Junior Golf Instructor is responsible for teaching the First Tee Nine Core Values, life skills and all aspects of the game of golf to kids and teens, through the delivery of First Tee's Golf and Life Skills Curriculum. The Junior Golf Instructor is also responsible for guiding and coaching young people to become responsible future citizens and committed, active golfers. This position will work with the Director of Golf and Education to lead classes. The program is taught in a fun and interactive way using a combination of both traditional golf and non-traditional methods.

Duties and Responsibilities

The role of the Junior Golf Instructor is to provide a high-quality, engaging learning experience. The includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Promote First Tee – Pikes Peak's mission by modeling the First Tee Nine Core Values and adherence to the First Tee Code of Conduct
- Be active in the First Tee Coach Program
- Assist in program set up, delivery and breakdown
- Proficient in the delivery of all programs and curriculum
- Be charismatic, personable, and motivational in working with kids and teens of all backgrounds
- Instruct off-season and supplemental programs, as needed
- Create opportunities for participants to play golf outside of regular schedule programming
- Encourage and assist qualified youth to participate in golf tournaments, Headquarters opportunities and local chapter events
- Make the game fun for youth participants
- Appreciate and care for program participants, provide encouragement and motivation to help youth maximize performance
- Provide instruction for clinics, workshops, and programs with schools and other youth serving organizations
- Ascend through First Tee coaching levels

 - Teaching the basic fundamental skills of golf, rules, etiquette, and playing procedures with youth
 - Working with youth, youth development
- Communicative
 - Prompt mobile communication with Director of Golf and Education and colleagues

 - Exemplifies a high standard in performance, dress, and conduct at all times
 - Strong work ethic, punctuality, and trust ensures program integrity and success

 - Sets an inspiring example for the youth and families served by First Tee – Pikes Peak
 - Patience and passion to help children grow into good golfers and better people

 - Ability to manage a group of 20+ youth and multiple volunteers
 - Contributes to and accountable for the performance of the team as a whole
- Flexible work Schedule
 - Sessions run each year from February-March (evenings), April-May (evenings), June-August (all day), and September-October (evenings)
 - School and Community programs are year round based on scheduling
- Able to travel to attend academies, regional and annual meetings and training sessions
